
## Regional Setting 2010

Recognition of diverse habitats & potential threats




## Regional Setting 2016

24 cruises on 5 NOAA ships

90,000 km<sup>2</sup> mapped

85 towed camera & 104 ROV dives

Identify knowledge gaps that would further management objectives










